### EXHIBIT: Boston 2050: High Water

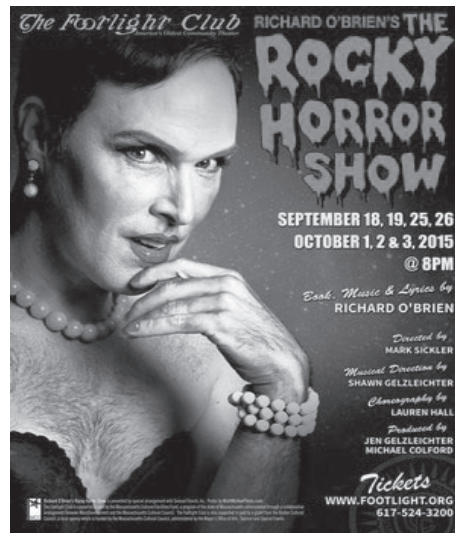

Beginning September 18th, the exhibition will be open Wednesday through Sunday 12pm-7pm. LIT is a comprehensive portrait by pioneer artist Lesley Schiff. The exhibition begins its multi-city tour in Boston at a pop-up museum in the new Van Ness building in The Fenway neighborhood, long known as a haven for rock artists and venues. Granted access to Bob Dylan's extensive archive, Miss Schiff creates a dynamic visual interpretation of an icon, his classic performances, his songs and his legacy. Consisting of selections from the series and the music that inspire the work, the exhibition is an immersive, multi-sensory experience.
